LATEST NEWS OF IMPORTANCE TO FACULTY

- Penn State's <u>COVID-19 Dashboard</u> shows ongoing results for all COVID-19 tests administered on campus since December 19, 2020, for faculty, staff, and students.
- Wednesday's spring webcast with President Eric Barron will focus on topics
 affecting employees. Joining Barron will be Lorraine Goffe, vice president for
 Human Resources and chief human resources officer, and Kelly Wolgast,
 director of the COVID-19 Operations Control Center. The livestream can be

- Students who completed quarantine and isolation at University Park are being surveyed to collect feedback about their experiences.
- Over the past year, the <u>Manufacturing and Sterilization to Address COVID-10</u>
 (<u>MASC</u>) <u>Initiative</u> has mobilized to protect health care providers and communities across Pennsylvania.
- Spring 2021 Holiday/Special Events Testing Schedule
 - Friday, April 2: no random testing (all campuses); one walk-up testing site open (Pegula Ice Arena).
 - Saturday, April 3: no random testing (all campuses); no walk-up testing.
 - Saturday, April 17: no testing at Pegula Ice Arena or Beaver Stadium (Hintz Family Alumni Center and 101 N. Atherton St. open as usual for walk-up and random testing, respectively); testing at the Commonwealth Campuses remains unchanged.
 - Friday, May 7: no random testing (all campuses); one walk-up testing site open (Pegula Ice Arena).
 - Saturday, May 8: no random testing (all campuses); no walk-up testing.

KEY REMINDERS FOR FACULTY

- April 1 is the deadline for tenure-line faculty in the penultimate year of their
 probationary period to accept a one-year extension to their probationary period
 due to COVID-19. By completing the online form "Confirmation of Extension of
 the Probationary Period Due to COVID-19," the faculty member's probationary
 period will be extended by one year. Detailed information is available here.
- Penn State and local leaders today appealed to students and local residents to redouble their safety efforts to curb the spread of the coronavirus.
- Penn State held a <u>livestream event for accepted students</u> and their families considering applying to Penn State, "<u>Class of 2025: A Virtual 'Welcome to the</u> <u>Penn State Community</u>," on March 25.
- In support of the "Mask Up or Pack Up" campaign, <u>frontline healthcare workers</u> <u>share advice on staying vigilant</u> and how everyone can do their part to help protect the Penn State community.
- University Park students are urged to <u>take advantage of walk-up COVID-19</u> <u>testing on campus</u> if they are concerned that they may have been exposed.
- Walk-up COVID-19 testing hours at the University Park campus will continue as follows:
 - Walk-up testing at the Hintz Family Alumni Center will be available
 Monday through Saturday from 9 a.m. 5 p.m.
 - Testing availability will change on the dates listed in "Latest News". More information is available <u>here</u>.

This walk-up testing is available to employees who are in the Return to Work database at University Park. Employees in that database also continue to have the option to do the opt-in mail kit testing.
