QUESTION FROM FACULTY

Q: I am concerned about academic integrity in my remote learning class. What messages should I communicate to my students about academic integrity and end-of-semester assessments?

A: It is strongly recommended that you share the following announcement with your students as part of the instructions for your end-of-semester assessment. You are welcome to either use this text verbatim or modify the information to suit the needs of your assessment or course.

"This assessment will evaluate two things. The first is your understanding of and ability to apply course information. The second is your integrity, your ability to face challenge with dignity and honesty. If you are tempted by dishonest opportunities, remember that students with an academic integrity violation will not be able to choose an alternative grade for this course."

 Penn State's <u>COVID-19 Dashboard</u> shows ongoing results for all COVID-19 tests administered on campus since December 19, 2020, for faculty, staff, and students.

- President Barron shared a <u>message with the University community</u> following the verdict in the Minneapolis trial.
- Penn State is strongly encouraging all students, faculty, and staff to sign up to get a vaccine as soon as they are eligible to receive one. Phase 2, which extends vaccine eligibility to all Pennsylvanians age 16 or older, began on April 13.
- Spring 2021 Holiday/Special Events Testing Schedule
 - Friday, May 7: no random testing (all campuses); one walk-up testing site open (Pegula Ice Arena).
 - o Saturday, May 8: no random testing (all campuses); no walk-up testing.
- Walk-up testing is available to employees who are in the Return to Work database at University Park. Employees in that database also continue to have the option to do the opt-in mail kit testing. Walk-up COVID-19 testing hours at the University Park campus will continue as follows:

- Walk-up testing at the Hintz Family Alumni Center will be available
 Monday through Saturday from 9 a.m. 5 p.m.
