LATEST NEWS OF IMPORTANCE TO FACULTY

- Penn State's <u>COVID-19 Dashboard</u> shows ongoing results for all COVID-19 tests administered on campus since December 19, 2020, for faculty, staff, and students.
- At a special meeting on May 12, the <u>Faculty Senate passed a nonbinding</u> <u>COVID-19 vaccine resolution</u> as well as a letter addressed to the Board of Trustees related to the Next Gen Penn State and search process to find the University's next president.
- A new study published in the Journal of Adolescent Health found that <u>1 in 6</u> <u>parents first allowed their adolescent children to have an alcoholic drink</u> with their families during the COVID-19 shutdown.
- According to Penn State College of Medicine researchers, <u>https://news.psu.edu/story/643864/2021/05/18/research/sufficient-knowledge-sense-information-overload-evident-early</u>, but were overwhelmed with worries about mixed messages and distrust of some sources.
- A Penn State course, <u>PHP 597, "Vaccines, Immunity, and Homeland Security:</u> <u>Case Study of the SARS-CoV-2 Pandemic</u>," gave students the chance to learn the science of the vaccine in real time.
- Students in Penn State College of Medicine support Penn State's vaccination efforts via a <u>student vaccine task force</u> whose members answer questions, monitor patients, and give vaccine doses.

KEY REMINDERS FOR FACULTY

 Penn State is <u>currently evaluating the new guidance from the Centers for</u> <u>Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and update from the Pennsylvania</u> <u>Department of Health regarding masking</u> for fully vaccinated individuals and will provide additional guidance to the University community. While the review is underway, masking and physical distancing is expected by all individuals — regardless of vaccination status — inside Penn State campus buildings and on public transportation across all campuses.

- Penn State's COVID-19 Operations Control Center has announced the <u>schedule</u> for drop-in COVID-19 testing at University Park through late June.
- In a new study, Penn State College of Medicine researchers found that <u>people</u> <u>living with HIV had a 24% higher risk of SARS-CoV-2 infection</u> and a 78% higher risk of death from COVID-19 than people without HIV.
- A recent survey by the Center for Survey Research at Penn State Harrisburg's Institute of State and Regional Affairs found that <u>many Pennsylvanians are</u> <u>"vaccine hesitant."</u>
- Penn State's COVID-19 Operations Control Center (COCC) has developed a <u>comprehensive COVID-19 mitigation strategy for the transitional month of May</u> <u>and the summer 2021 semester for all campuses</u> that includes vaccine consideration, masking, testing, contact tracing, and quarantine and isolation.
- The <u>Regional Vaccination Clinic at the Bryce Jordan Center has resumed</u> <u>operations as scheduled on Thursday, May 6</u>, offering both the two-dose Moderna vaccine and the single-dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine. Starting May 13, the clinic will only offer the second dose of Moderna and the single dose J&J vaccine.
- Walk-up testing is available to employees who are in the Return to Work database at University Park. Employees in that database also continue to have the option to do the opt-in mail kit testing. Walk-up COVID-19 testing hours at the University Park campus will continue as follows:
 - Walk-up testing at the Hintz Family Alumni Center will be available Monday through Saturday from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.
