News for Faculty and Instructors: Penn State and COVID-19

QUESTION FROM FACULTY:

Q: Can I require students to wear a mask in my class?

A: As of June 28, masks are optional for those who are fully vaccinated (two weeks after the second dose in a two-dose series or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine), including in classroom, advising, and student services spaces. Unvaccinated individuals must continue to wear masks indoors at all times. If you want someone to wear a mask when interacting with you, you can request that they do so, but cannot require it. It is important to note that those who are working in or visiting designated health care environments must continue to wear masks indoors and maintain distancing regardless of vaccination status.

In individual offices, faculty may post <u>this sign</u> if they wish to request that people entering wear a mask.

KEY REMINDERS FOR FACULTY

- International travel requests must be submitted 30 days in advance of departure date. Detailed information about how to submit an international travel request can be found here.
- Penn State researchers used sound signals captured by underground fiber-optic sensors to <u>understand how COVID impacted human activities</u>.

- During the pandemic, Tech TAs helped faculty and instructors <u>manage the technology associated with their newly remote courses</u>.
- Students are being asked to complete a <u>short and anonymous survey about their current COVID-19 vaccination status</u> or plans to get vaccinated before the start of the fall semester.
- Penn State researchers <u>designed a synthetic defective SARS-CoV-2 virus</u> that is innocuous but interferes with the real virus' growth, potentially causing the extinction of both the disease-causing virus and the synthetic virus.
- Penn State is continuing to <u>encourage students and employees to share their coronavirus vaccination status</u> to help inform the University's decision-making and its COVID-19 management plan. Employees can provide their vaccination status using <u>SalesForce Health Cloud</u>, a secure online platform.
- <u>Faculty can still submit questions</u> related to Penn State's COVID response.
