QUESTION FROM FACULTY

Q: What do I do if a student in my class has been placed on interim suspension due to noncompliance with the University's required weekly testing?

A: University Park faculty and instructors received a <u>letter</u> from Executive Vice President and Provost Nick Jones about students who have been placed on interim suspension due to failure to comply with the University's required weekly COVID-19 testing. The letter describes the consequences for students on interim suspension and how faculty and instructors should handle those students' absences.

LATEST NEWS OF IMPORTANCE TO FACULTY

- University Park students who are subject to required weekly COVID-19 testing and who have missed at least three weeks of testing have been notified that they are out of compliance with the University's health and safety policies and <u>have</u> <u>been placed on interim suspension</u> through the Office of Student Conduct.
- The <u>COVID-19 testing site at Pegula Ice Arena closed</u> on Wednesday, September 22. COVID-19 testing at White Building is available from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Sundays through Fridays for students living on or near the University Park campus, and faculty and staff who are working on campus.
- University Park employees who are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms should use <u>this document</u> to identify a testing site in the community.
- Penn State's <u>COVID-19 Dashboard</u> will be updated <u>twice weekly</u>, on Tuesdays and Thursdays, during the fall semester.
- <u>Penn State and Centre Volunteers in Medicine will host a COVID-19 vaccine</u> <u>clinic</u> at University Park on September 25 prior to the Penn State-Villanova game.

KEY REMINDERS FOR FACULTY

- This <u>graphic</u> was created by Denise Solomon, head of the Department of Communication Arts and Sciences, and was recently updated in collaboration with Penn State Contact Tracing. It is a clear representation of what faculty may do to assist the contact tracing process and their students.
- The U.S. Department of State is warning that passport processing times are taking, on average, 12 to 18 weeks, not including mailing time. More information is available <u>here</u>. Education Abroad is advising students that if they are planning to study abroad in spring semester, they must <u>apply for a passport</u> *immediately* and through the *expedited process*.
- COVID-19 vaccination data for all Penn State campuses is now available on the University's COVID-19 dashboard.
- Penn State Health is once again making a <u>public COVID-19 dashboard available</u> on its website. The dashboard includes vital information from each of its acute care hospitals. Statistics include total number of adult and pediatric COVID-19 inpatients, number of patients requiring intensive care unit care, and patient vaccination status.
- Penn State is continuing to <u>encourage students and employees to share their</u> <u>coronavirus vaccination status</u> to help inform the University's decision-making and its COVID-19 management plan. Employees can provide their vaccination status using <u>SalesForce Health Cloud</u>, a secure online platform.
