QUESTION FROM FACULTY

Q: Are faculty 'work adjustments' available for spring semester 2022?

A: Guidance has been updated and released to inform faculty and instructors of oncampus work expectations and the <u>work adjustments process</u> for spring 2022. A document describing the work adjustment process and criteria is available <u>here</u>. Faculty with an approved work adjustment for fall 2021 may apply for an extension of their work adjustment to spring 2022 <u>here</u>. The form for faculty who do not currently have a work adjustment, but who want to request one for spring 2022, is available <u>here</u>. The deadline to apply for a spring semester work adjustment is October 29.

LATEST NEWS OF IMPORTANCE TO FACULTY

- In compliance with President Biden's executive order requiring COVID-19
 vaccination for all federal employees, contractors, and others, Penn State has
 determined that <u>all University Park faculty and staff must submit proof that they
 are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 by December 8.
 </u>
- A research project conducted jointly by the Penn State College of Medicine and Penn State University Libraries will <u>assess COVID-19 beliefs</u>, including vaccine <u>hesitancy</u>, throughout the Penn State community.
- A Penn State-led research team will measure the <u>rapid changes in greenhouse</u> <u>gas emissions</u> that resulted from lower traffic levels and efforts to curb transmission of the virus.
- According to Penn State College of Medicine researchers, more than half of the 236 million people who have been diagnosed with COVID-19 worldwide since December 2019 will <u>experience post-COVID symptoms</u> up to 6 months after recovering.
- Penn State will <u>award \$50 million in emergency relief</u> to help students enrolled during the fall 2021 semester to cover any component of their cost of attendance or other emergency expenses due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

• Penn State's <u>COVID-19 Dashboard</u> will be updated <u>twice weekly</u>, on Tuesdays and Thursdays, during the fall semester.

KEY REMINDERS FOR FACULTY

- More than five weeks into the fall semester, the <u>COVID-19 vaccination rates</u> <u>among students, faculty, and staff at University Park are continuing to rise</u> as the positivity rate of University COVID-19 testing declines. As of October 7, the overall vaccination rate among all students at University Park is more than 87%, and the seven-day positivity rate of all testing conducted by Penn State at University Park is 0.4%. Penn State is urging students who have not yet been vaccinated against COVID-19 to begin the process now so that they can be fully vaccinated before leaving campus for the Thanksgiving break.
- A "contingency planning" <u>document</u> has been developed that assists academic unit heads (department heads, director of academic affairs, school directors, division heads) in planning for the possibility of a faculty member's extended absence from a class, or multiple student absences in a single class, that may strain instructional capacity. Faculty members may also find this document useful to review.
- <u>COVID-19 testing at White Building</u> is available from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Sundays through Fridays for students living on or near the University Park campus, and faculty and staff who are working on campus.
- Penn State is continuing to <u>encourage students and employees to share their</u> <u>coronavirus vaccination status</u> to help inform the University's decision-making and its COVID-19 management plan. Employees can provide their vaccination status using <u>SalesForce Health Cloud</u>, a secure online platform.
- <u>Faculty can still submit questions</u> related to Penn State's COVID response. Questions may be submitted <u>here</u>.
