QUESTION FROM FACULTY

Q: I'm confident I uploaded my vaccine card. Do I really need to check?

A: Yes! Even if you're fairly certain that you uploaded your vaccine card to Salesforce, please check to be sure by visiting <u>Salesforce Health Cloud</u>. If you do not have a vaccine card uploaded into Salesforce, you will be considered out of compliance with the vaccine mandate.

LATEST NEWS OF IMPORTANCE TO FACULTY

- Penn State has determined that the COVID-19 vaccination mandate already in place at seven campuses must be <u>extended to the Berks and Schuylkill</u> <u>campuses</u> and to <u>the College of Medicine</u> because of work being conducted under federal contracts and agreements. Proof of vaccination must be uploaded into the University's <u>Salesforce Health Cloud</u>, a secure online platform for collecting health data. Faculty and instructors can also check to see if they have uploaded proof of vaccination using Salesforce Health Cloud.
- Penn State Health will <u>comply with President Joe Biden's COVID-19 Action Plan</u> <u>mandating vaccination</u> as a condition of employment for federal contractors.
- <u>Strategically increasing testing capacity</u>, either by making diagnostic tests faster or more available, can reduce reliance on costly preventative interventions, such as distancing and shutdowns, according to a team of researchers led by Penn State.
- More than 80% of the white-tailed deer sampled in different parts of Iowa between December 2020 and January 2021 tested positive for SARS-CoV-2.
- Penn State's <u>COVID-19 Dashboard</u> will be updated <u>twice weekly</u>, on Tuesdays and Thursdays, during the fall semester.

VACCINATION MANDATE RESOURCES

Employees who perform work at or with the following campuses must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and share proof of their vaccination with the University by December 8: Altoona, Behrend, Berks, Brandywine, DuBois, Fayette, Harrisburg, Schuylkill, the College of Medicine, all Penn State Extension employees across the commonwealth, and University Park.
