News for Faculty and Instructors: Penn State and COVID-19

QUESTION FROM FACULTY

Q: Does the federal contractor mandate injunction affect testing?

A: While the Supreme Court blocked the OSHA vaccine mandate yesterday, it is the federal contractor vaccine mandate that will apply to all Penn State locations if the injunction is lifted by the courts. Under the federal contractor vaccine mandate, all employees at all Penn State campuses are required to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 or have an approved medical/disability or religious-related accommodation. Because this mandate is currently under an injunction it will not be implemented by Penn State on January 4. This injunction, however, could be lifted in the near future. In the meantime, the University will continue with the current testing protocols already in place. Read the full FAQ here.

LATEST NEWS OF IMPORTANCE TO FACULTY

- University Health Services is administering <u>free first and second doses and booster COVID-19 vaccinations for all students</u> in the Student Health Center at University Park starting January 12.
- At University Park, <u>drop-in and by-appointment asymptomatic COVID-19 testing is available seven days a week at White Building for students</u> living on or near campus. At all Commonwealth Campuses, student tests will be distributed by the student health center or designated office, or ordered through the mail via the Vault Health mail-in test kit.
- More than 1,000 people received COVID-19 vaccine doses at the latest vaccination clinic hosted by Centre Volunteers in Medicine and Penn State on January 9.
- According to researchers in Penn State College of Medicine, the <u>public's</u>
 willingness to comply with CDC recommendations correlates with COVID-19
 <u>case projections</u> in zip codes where those surveyed about their intended behaviors live.

According to economists in the College of Agricultural Sciences, Pennsylvania's
labor economy showed resilience during the first two decades of the 21st century,
but <u>certain industry sectors and regions of the state continued along a trend line</u>
of job loss in the run-up to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The Office of Physical Plant continues its <u>University-wide effort to manage</u> <u>ventilation throughout campus facilities</u> and closely monitor indoor air ventilation recommendations related to COVID-19.
- Students, faculty, staff, and visitors are urged to wear well-fitting, multi-layered masks in accordance with the latest University and federal guidance.

 are asked to inform their academic unit head (department head, director of
 academic affairs, school director, division head) when remote instruction is
 offered.
