LATEST NEWS OF IMPORTANCE TO FACULTY

- April 1 is the deadline for tenure-line faculty in the penultimate year of their
 probationary period to accept a one-year extension to their probationary period
 due to COVID-19. By completing the online form "Confirmation of Extension of
 the Probationary Period Due to COVID-19," the faculty member's probationary
 period will be extended by one year. Detailed information is available here.
- Faculty, staff, and academic administrators should have received an email on Wednesday, March 16 inviting them to participate in the AC14 annual review of academic administrators. You are invited to provide feedback to academic administrators in your unit with whom you have had the opportunity to work in the past year. - Penn State students in need of financial assistance due to the COVID-19
 pandemic can now apply for a <u>spring 2022 American Rescue Plan student</u>
 <u>emergency grant</u> from the University's Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund
 (HEERF) III allocation.
- "Tips for Writing a Narrative Statement," the final workshop in the four-part
 Promotion and Tenure Workshop Series
 offered by the Office of the Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs, will be held on Thursday, March 24 from 2-3 p.m. via Zoom.
- Sandeep Krishnakumar, doctoral candidate in industrial engineering, and a team investigated the <u>experience of first-year engineering students during the shift to</u> <u>online learning</u> and its effect on their capacity to thrive.

KEY REMINDERS FOR FACULTY

- With cases of COVID-19 declining on Penn State campuses and across the state
 and nation, University officials are <u>adjusting Penn State's indoor masking policy</u>
 to no longer require face masks be worn in many indoor common spaces on
 campuses in counties designated by the Centers for Disease Control and
 Prevention (CDC) to have low or medium <u>COVID-19 Community Levels</u>
 beginning Monday, March 7. Based on the new CDC guidance, at this time, all
 Penn State campuses except for the College of Medicine will adjust their
 masking requirements.
