SDR Exam Center and Pollock Testing Center

The SDR Exam Center will be open Friday evening and Saturday morning to support the University's rescheduled final exam schedule. Faculty who have SDR students with exams scheduled for Thursday should have gotten an email either Wednesday night or Thursday morning about this from the SDR exam center.

The Pollock Testing Center also will be open to support rescheduled exams and is working directly with instructors on this.

Grade Submission

Faculty members will have until Tuesday at 5:00 p.m. to submit their grades. This will provide instructors with flexibility as well as ensure timely end-of-term processing.

Faculty Senate Meeting

At its November 29 meeting, the <u>Faculty Senate heard updates</u> on the University's efforts to redesign its budget allocation model, Penn State's approach to enrollment management, and the recommendation to reunify the two law schools.

TLT Faculty Fellows

Eight instructors from two campuses and six colleges worked in teams with Teaching and Learning with Technology over the past two years as part of the <u>2020-22 TLT</u> <u>Faculty Fellows program</u>. As the next cohort gets underway, the previous cohort shared lessons learned from their work.

The Biden administration is making rapid Covid tests available for free again this winter through a limited round of ordering. Households can now order a total of four rapid Covid tests for free at CovidTests.gov. According to a release by the White House, orders will start shipping next week, just days before families gather for the Christmas holiday, and deliveries will continue in the following weeks.

Penn State officials are reminding the University community to continue to take precautions and personal health measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and other illnesses during the holiday gathering and travel season.
