Faculty Senate October Meeting Recap

At its Oct. 17 meeting, the Faculty Senate heard updates on the University's strategic planning process and from the Board of Trustees leadership on their priorities and areas of focus. The Senate also passed legislation revising its standing rules of procedure and bylaws.

Tenured and Promoted Faculty Honored

Recently tenured and promoted faculty across the University were honored Oct. 2 through Penn State's <u>Promotion and Tenure Recognition Program</u>. As part of that tradition, each newly tenured or promoted faculty member is asked to select a book title for the University Libraries' permanent collection and to submit a personal statement explaining why they chose that book.

Non-Tenure-Line Faculty Promotions Celebrated

Penn State celebrated the promotions of <u>teaching</u>, <u>research</u>, <u>clinical</u>, <u>and library faculty</u> <u>who received promotions</u> during an Oct. 6 event. This year's event was sponsored by the Office of the Executive Vice President and hosted by the Schreyer Institute for Teaching Excellence and Office of the Senior Vice President for Research.

Activity Insight Topic of the Month

Is your past Alternate Assessment of Teaching Effectiveness data not appearing in your Dossier? Chances are you still have it entered in the old screen. In December of 2022 the Faculty Activity Management Services (FAMS) team created a screen specifically

Assessment of Teaching Effectiveness News

- The Schreyer Institute for Teaching Excellence has created a website that
 provides an overview of Penn State's approach to assessment of teaching
 effectiveness <u>here</u>. You can also read the Penn State news story about the new

- Penn State has a new instrument for gathering end-of-course student feedback. Effective fall 2023, the <u>Student Educational Experience Questionnaire (SEEQ)</u> will be administered to students during weeks 12-14 of the semester to collect student feedback. Thus, annual reviews for 2023 will include both SRTE and SEEQ data.
- 3. All faculty are required to submit a self-reflection of about 1,000 words focused on their teaching as part of their annual review materials. Faculty will be able to submit these self-reflections via Activity Insight.

Procedures for Winter Weather Cancellations

In the event of a change in normal campus operations due to weather or an emergency, in-person courses cannot, except in extenuating circumstances, be moved to a synchronous remote meeting, per Faculty Senate Policy <u>45-00</u>. View the full article about winter weather procedures <u>here</u>.

Reminder re: Flu, COVID Vaccines

Now is the time for Penn State employees to protect themselves and those around them by getting the flu and COVID-19 vaccination. The University strongly encourages all employees to take the time to receive these vaccines this fall. There are many opportunities for employees throughout the commonwealth to receive their vaccinations. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends an annual flu vaccination for anyone six months of age and older, with some exceptions. A new COVID-19 vaccine is starting to appear at pharmacies around the U.S. Approved and authorized by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) in mid-September, everyone ages six months and older is eligible to receive it.

Faculty Passing

Ryan Russell, associate professor of graphic design in the College of Arts & Architecture's Stuckeman School, passed away on October 23 after a prolonged illness. His <u>children's book</u>, "My Annoying, Irritating, Always-in-the-way Shadow," has been published by Harriman House and will be released on Dec. 12.

The case study was created by faculty from the College of the Liberal Arts, Department of Communication Arts and Sciences, and Communication Arts and Sciences faculty from Penn State Berks, working in collaboration with the Office for General Education, as part of the Faculty Scholars civic engagement cohort.
